# Introduction

**Peoples Development Community (PDC)** is a national NGO working with several sectors and many parts of Bangladesh since 2003 for different vulnerable and marginalized community. PDC working with pioneering role in sexual and reproductive health and HIV/AIDS prevention strategies in collaboration with Government, donors, INGOs, research & academic institutions and civil societies. It has been working with other organizations for advocacy and campaign to establish the human and legal rights, minimizing discrimination and stigma among the vulnerable and marginalized community. PDC also addressing Basic literacy Education, Livelihood skills training, violence against women, empowerment and community development issues.

PDC started with its mission for contributing to reduce the violation of human rights to poor specially women and marginalized groups of the community through advocacy, community mobilization and community empowerment and thrives for Bangladesh where all sectors contribute to uphold human rights and the people, specifically women of all level living dignity, justice and social rights.



Peoples Development Community (PDC) has a seven member executive committee. Executive Director Lead the organization and a group of advisors consist of technical experts in different fields related to respective project issues provide supports in project management and program development. Each project is managed by

respective project staffs headed by respective Project Coordinator/Team Leader. Over all general management and procurements manage by separate team headed by respective departmental Head.

Peoples Development Community (PDC) has 13 years of work experience. PDC handled a total of Taka 54,046,830.00 in year 2015 funded by mainly GFATM through Save the Children Fund USA, Ministry Health and Family Welfares, World Bank through NASP and Dutch Foreign Ministry - BUZA through HASAB.

In previous PDC implemented projects on Providing Health, Nutrition and Family Planning services under Ministry of Health and Family Planning, Post literacy and continuing Education for Human Development Project (PLCEHD-1) funded by World Bank and Hope for children, UK. PDC has track record of success in influencing similar social actors as mentioned above during the implementation of the programs as mentioned.



PDC recently completed the Feasibility study of **FK Norway Exchange Program** in collaboration with its Indian Partner JPISC and designing a project within the FK framework that to be started in February 2019.

PDC presently running a clinic in Jashor through which provide the essential services for **Reproductive Health and Family Planning Services** in Jashor Municipality area with the support of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.

A part from that PDC also implementing **HIV and AIDS Prevention Services Projects** including basic literacy education and livelihood skills training with the support of World Bank and GFATM through National AIDS/STD Programme (NASP) and Save the Children International in deferent areas of Bangladesh. **“Link Up: Better Sexual and Reproductive Health & Rights (SRHR) for Young People Affected by HIV”** project implementing among Hotel, Street & Residence based Female Sex Worker in Khulna Division with the support Dutch Foreign Ministry - BUZA through HASAB.

## Our Projects at a Glance

### Projects in 2017-18

During the period of 2017-18 Peoples Development Community (PDC) executes four projects with the financial assistance of Ministry of Health and Family Planning. Main focuses of these projects were to prevent HIV/ AIDS and STI, basic literacy education, livelihood skills training, providing services for advance sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) and HIV through linking up with existing programs as well as provision of essential clinical services for Reproductive Health and Family Planning. The projects also deal with building capacity and protecting rights of marginalized population, poor community peoples and women. The Geographical coverage of the projects were Dhaka City, Chittagong City, Sylhet City, Faridpur Town and Khulna Division. The descriptions of the projects are as below:
